

## Rules and Regulations for Comprehensive Examination

1. Master's students choosing study program Plan B must take the comprehensive examination.
2. The University will appoint a committee of qualified scholars to administer the written examination and supervise the examination procedures.
3. The University will administer the comprehensive examination four times each year. The date time and place of the examination will be announced prior to the actual examination date.
4. Students eligible to sit for the comprehensive examination must have the following qualifications:
  - 4.1 Have completed all courses required in the particular program of study excluding the independent study.
  - 4.2 Have received accumulative grade point average of no less than 3.00 (excluding the Independent study)
5. Students are allowed to take the written examinations no more than three times and must obtain a grade of no less than sixty percent to pass. If that examination consists of more than one part, students are required to retake only the failed part(s).
6. Students who are unable to pass the examination as specified will be dismissed.
